




MEETING GROUP INFORMATION



We wonder what we are going to do. Someone Else left a wonderful example to follow, but who is going to follow it? Who is going to do the things Someone Else did? Remember, we can't depend on Someone Else anymore.





The 'Head-Spinning' Thoughts of a Newsletter Editor...

As the year "2023' draws closer to the end of "District 5's" Panel 72 (2022-23) and as I'm readying my "Spirit of Rotation" torches for passing onto the Panel 74 (2024-25) volunteers, my "Being of Service" (self-centered / self-serving / ego based) 'head-spinning' thoughts are all over the place.

Afterall, all I had to do was commit to attending a monthly District 5 meeting for a hour and ahalf, and then report back to my meeting group what I heard...what I learned...about the current AA fellowship (district, area, and GS0) news. Yep! That definitely worked for me!

(Yes, I do hear God laughing at my "easiest and least time consuming" willingness, because ...)

Little did I know then that my 6SR commitment would eventually lead me to wanting to volunteer for various district level positions, which would then lead me to wanting to volunteer for an area level position.

It didn't happen overnight. In fact, I have no problem admitting that it took about 3 months of my being a GSR and attending the District 5 meetings for me to even slightly understand what the heck they were talking about. Gratefully, though, I knew a few who were District 5 Trusted Servants / Officers at the time, and because I had the (*lack of ego*) courage to do so, I reached out to them and asked questions. Which they willingly and graciously, and to the best of their experience and knowledge, answered. Or, if the questions warranted, offered their 'suggestions'.

(As an FYI...based on my experience, whenever a position holder doesn't know the answer, it's always beneficial to put fear and ego aside and ask someone that may.)

My sharing with you which District 5 positions I have held, or now hold, is not important. As that's not what this article is all about.

It's about my stopping my 'self-centered / self-serving / ego' head-spinning thoughts of:

- "But I really enjoy my position and what it entails."
- "Others compliment me on the job I'm doing."
- "Will someplace else know how to do it correctly, and have the willingness to spend the time needed to do so?" (The latter, of course, meaning my ego's interpretation of correctly and time needed.)
- "For District 5 and it's members' benefit, I need / have to keep the 'torch' if no one else volunteers to take it."

So, how will I stop those thoughts?? I will try to do my very 'alcoholic' best by turning them over to my Higher Power and allowing Him to show me 'how' and 'where' I can best be of District 5 - Panel 74 service when the time comes during our District 5 elections on November 9th. And I'll continue to remind myself that the "Spirit of Rotation" torch I pass on may be the very one that helps another alcoholic stay sober.

As this will be the last Panel 72 newsletter, let me express how grateful I am to all of you for taking the time to read the newsletters, for not pointing out my many mistakes in them and, most of all, for helping me remain sober 'one day at a time' because of having been the newsletter editor.
