



STEPS:4, 5, AND

Short Form:

"Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves."

Short Form:

"Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another . human being the exact nature of our wronas."

Short Form:

"Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character."

STEP 4: "Moral is an adjective that means relating to the standards of good or bad behavior, fairness, honesty, etc. that each person believes in..."



TRADITIONS: 4,

Short Form:

"Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or A.A. as a whole."

Short Form:

"Each group has but one primary purpose-to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers."

[6] **Short Form:**

"An A.A. group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the A.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property, and prestige divert us from our primary purpose."

TRADITION 4 (Long Form): "With respect to its own affairs, each A.A. group should be responsible to no other authority than its own conscience. But when its plans concern the welfare of neighboring groups also, those groups ought to be consulted. And no group, regional committee, or individual should ever take any action that might greatly affect A.A. as a whole without conferring with the trustees of the General Service Board. On such issues our common welfare is paramount."

"It was around my fifth year of sobriety when a friend asked if I would join him on an AA panel. He informed me it was at a prison. My first reaction, which I kept to myself, was fear of the location and that I would not know what to say. During my drinking years, I had been incarcerated in city and county jails but did not identify with prison. I accepted his invitation to be a one-time visitor. He had me approved to join him and a few others to attend his panel.

I recall the metal detector and sign-in process being a bit strict. The chat with the others on the way in did put me at ease. Going through the hallway with the sound of heavy doors shutting behind made me a bit nervous at first. Being led by our prison sponsor to the prison yard and watching the inmates doing their outdoor activities looked like a scene from a movie. From there, we went into the chapel. After the inmates filed in, we said the Serenity Prayer. The other panel members shared first. I was taught to just share my own experience. I said a quick prayer for help with what to say. I will not forget the feelings I experienced of being part of a greater purpose. I am not so occupied with myself and have a stronger awareness of God when I do this.

My friend invited me back to this panel, and I later joined Alcoholics Anonymous Hospitals and Institutions. I now have forty years of sobriety and have learned that the feelings of gratitude, peace, and belonging far outweigh the sacrifice required to do this.

I thank God for helping me to find and continue this way of service."

- GENERAL SERVICE REPRESENTATIVE (GSR) CORNER -



<u>"WHAT IT MEANS TO BE A GSR"</u>

"...The role of the general service representative, or GSR, is essential to the purpose of general service. Bill W. wrote in Concept I of The Twelve Concepts for World Service: "The A.A. groups today hold ultimate responsibility and final authority for our world services." The role of the GSR is essential to ensuring that groups can fulfill that responsibility. Only when a GSR keeps the group informed and communicates the group conscience can the Conference truly act for A.A. as a whole. This communication is a two-way street, making the GSR responsible not only for bringing forward the group's voice, but for taking back to the group Conference actions that affect the Fellowship's unity, health and growth..."

"MAKING REPORTS"

"GSRs are asked to regularly make reports to their groups to keep them informed about what's going on in A.A. as a whole. In some instances, the GSR may be asked to get the group's feedback on certain topics.

A group may have a customary format or time for when a GSR may give a report. Some groups ask the GSR to give a report during announcements in the regular A.A. meeting. Some prefer the report to be given during business meetings. Some welcome both. Most groups prefer the reports to be shorter rather than longer. A group may also decline to hear reports from a GSR at all..."

Below is one suggestion from a past Montana Area 40 Delegate...

"MAKING REPORTS TO THOSE YOU SERVE"

"When we begin a new job in Alcoholics Anonymous, we need some guidance on fulfilling our tasks. One thing that can be hard for a new GSR is reporting to those you serve in your home group and to those you serve with at the district level. Here are some tips that come from experience, strength and hope from a past GSR.

When giving reports at your group or district, it's probably best to be brief. Things you might present to the district are:

- Any new group officers or other service position holders.
- Who your Alt. GSR is.
- What the average attendance is at group meetings.
- How your group divides its funds for contributions.
- Any problems the group may be facing such as having to move, court referrals, dual diagnosis members (alcoholism coupled with a mental illness), non-alcoholic addicts, lack of interest in service, etc.
- Announce any upcoming events and any group activities.

And, things you might report to your Group include:

- News of any events or workshops you learned about at the district meeting.
- New district officers and other service people.
- Try to report on things that you think the group can relate to or is interested or involved in.
- If there is an issue coming up that will require your vote, try to explain it as simply, fully, and fairly as possible so that they can arrive at an informed group conscience.

With a bit of practice, you can probably work in a piece of Information that will provoke a question and get the discussion started.


You may not personally agree with your group's conscience but if you have done your job correctly and discussed it enough, you will have no problem in abiding by it; and can rightly feel good about it, too.

Probably the most important thing that you can do as a GSR is to become an informed one. This serves both us personally and A.A. as a whole. The more you know, the more you can share from personal experience and the more credible your voice will become."


